Day - 1







Deep South- around Hambantota


Overview

City of Hambantotoa, one of the most important provincial capitals is located in Deep South, Southern Province of Sri Lanka, approximately 200 KMS from Colombo, and the commercial capital of Sri Lanka. During the period of ancient kings of Sri Lanka, the region around Hambantota was known as 'Magampura', was the center of liberation movement led by kings against the foreign invaders who occupied Sri Lanka. The region was once the center of a prospering civilization in Sri Lanka, played a pivotal role in building the nation and nurturing its Buddhist culture. Currently, Hambantotoa is a well-developed city with good road network connected through expressways with other parts of Sri Lanka, an International Airport, International sea port, International Convention Center and a luxury hotel network.

The tourists feel fascinated by the panoramic views of the natural beauty of Hambantota. They also find the best opportunity to discover the flora and fauna in the natural habitat in this area. Also famous the city as the salt capital of Sri Lanka, the biggest producer of salt in the country.

What to see in Ella-Haputale?

Haputale located at an elevation of 1431 m above the sea level. The area has a rich bio-diversity dense with numerous varieties of flora and fauna. Haputale is surrounded by hills covered with cloud forests and tea plantations. Although there is much more to do in Ella, there is one other thing that makes Haputale so worth visiting. And that's the fact it's actually closer than Ella to some of the best things to do in the area. Despite being a small town, there are actually a ton of awesome things to do in Haputale/Ella in Sri Lanka.

Day - 2


Early morning visit Worlds End (By Jeep), with picnic breakfast

Bus stops at Ramboda Water Falls for an optional dip in natural pool in the water fall

Lunch

After lunch take the bus to Kandy, the hill capital of Sri Lanka Arrival of Kandy in the evening; Transfer to a Homestay located at an Organic Farm close to the Mahaweli River, the longest river in Sri Lanka

Kandy; Overview

Kandy is the most beautiful city in Sri Lanka. It is one of the eighth UNEESCO World Heritage sites. This sacred Buddhist site, popularly known as the city of Senkadagalapura, was the last capital of the Sinhala kings whose patronage enabled the Sinahala culture to flourish for more than 2,500 years until the occupation of Sri Lanka by the British in 1815. It is also the site of the Temple of the Tooth Relic (the sacred tooth of the Buddha), which is a famous pilgrimage site and the most photographed Buddhist religious site in the world!.

Day - 1


Take public Transport to Habarana, hub of the Cultural Triangle;


What to see in Kandy
